HBB FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What does it mean to register as an HBB?

Registration is a two-step process. First, you must comply with all host-nation rules and regulations regarding business transactions. This includes licensing, taxation, etc. Second, you must register with the garrison per Army regulations.

Do I have to register as an HBB with the garrison?

Yes, if you are a SOFA certificate holder, you must register your home-based business with the garrison whether you live on or off post. If you are teleworking for another company or 100% online AND do not see clients in-person, or have products in hand, no.

Do I have to register with the local German economy?

If you are earning any revenue from business or telework in Germany that is not protected under SOFA status, you are required to register with Germany. If you are uncertain, contact a local German accountant to discuss the requirements.

Do I have to pay both US and German income taxes?

Potentially. Consult with tax professionals regarding thresholds for taxation and rules regarding foreign income.

Is there someone who can help me through this process?

For the German side of this process, it is recommended that you contact a German tax professional. For the garrison, ACS is available to provide information on the processing requirements. In addition, you can review AER 210-70, community groups for HBBs, or reach out to approved HBB owners as well.































How long does the process take?

The process to register with local German authorities can be several weeks to several months. It depends on multiple factors, including the accuracy of your applications; the type of registrations required for your business; and the local office workload. The process for the garrison once you submit your completed package is less than 60 days.

What are the consequences of not registering?

Failure to properly register your HBB violates U.S. Army in Europe regulations and leaves you susceptible to military administrative or civilian misconduct action, as well as fines and prosecution from German authorities as it may be considered tax evasion. You could jeopardize your SOFA status. See AER 210-70.

Principal purpose(s): All information will be used to determine eligibility for home-based business (HBB) authorization on Army installations in Europe and is needed to conduct criminal and intelligence files checks.

Routine use(s): This form will be filed and will be destroyed 3 years after termination of the Army in Europe commercial activity authorization. Other routine uses are listed in 40 Federal Register 35151.

Mandatory or voluntary disclosure and effect on individual not providing information: Providing the requested information is mandatory if the applicant desires to be issued an HBB authorization.

This application is required **only** for individuals properly residing in **Government-owned or -leased quarters**. Individuals residing in **privately owned or leased quarters (off post)** and intending to conduct commercial activities on post must use AEA Form 210-70F and follow the commercial solicitation permit procedures.

The enclosed copy of AEA Form 210-70A bearing your signature certifies that you understand all the requirements necessary to engage in revenue-generating activities. Failure to comply with any of the directives or providing additional services, not approved by the garrison commander, will result in the loss of your privileges to conduct business on this installation. In addition, you are advised that you may not use your U.S. Forces-plated privately owned vehicle, tax-free fuel, any items purchased from AAFES stores, AAFES catalog, the commissary, or products purchased tax-free or imported duty free through the APO or by any other means in support of this business. The use of such tax-exempt facilities, products, or conveniences constitutes a violation of HN customs and tax laws.

The posting or distribution of flyers must be coordinated with the installation commander or a designated official. Posting or distributing flyers in Government housing must be approved by each building and stairwell coordinator. You may advertise your HBB in the Stars and Stripes and local military community papers and magazines.

Approval of this application does not imply any relationship between the applicant and the U.S. Government. The applicant is solely responsible for any liabilities associated with this business. HBB owners must apply for commercial solicitation privileges before conducting any solicitation on Army installations.

**CERTIFICATE OF UNDERSTANDING
FOR U.S. FORCES FAMILY MEMBERS TO ENGAGE IN COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES**

(AEA Reg 210-70)

1. I have read and understand AR 210-7 and AEA Regulation 210-70. I understand that a violation of these regulations could result in the withdrawal of my commercial activity privileges. Furthermore, I understand the following limitations on my commercial activities and certify that I will comply with these limitations:

- a. I will not use the Military Postal Service to send or receive mail or merchandise connected with my commercial activities.
- b. I will use neither a U.S. Forces-plated vehicle nor tax-free gasoline in any vehicle connected with my commercial activities.
- c. I will not use my duty-free import privileges to import any merchandise, advertising material, or other items to be used in connection with my commercial activities.
- d. For home-based business purposes, I will not use Government-owned or -leased quarters as business premises, showrooms, stores, or storage areas for goods intended for commercial resale if such business operations intervene or restrain any form of daily living activities.
- e. I will not take legal title to merchandise for commercial resale to comply with this regulation while, in fact, allowing any unauthorized company or person (including active-duty U.S. military personnel and DOD civilians limited by DOD 5500.7-R) to operate a commercial enterprise under the guise of my commercial activity privileges.
- f. I will not employ or use the services of active-duty U.S. military personnel or DOD civilians contrary to the provisions of DOD 5500.7-R as agents, brokers, or salespersons in the operation of a commercial activity.
- g. I will not lend, reproduce, or alter my letter of authorization.
- h. I will not use any type of official identification document other than my letter of authorization, AEA Form 210-70F, or AEA Form 210-70G to gain access to Army installations for the purpose of commercial activities.
- i. I will comply with the provisions of AEA Regulation 210-70, in particular the following:
 - (1) I will not solicit door-to-door on Army installations, including Government-owned or -leased housing, except at the personal invitation of an individual residing in the area.
 - (2) I will not solicit or make appointments with military personnel in barracks and dayrooms or when they are on duty, nor will I solicit civilian employees during duty hours.

2. Additionally, I am aware that--

- a. If required by local law, I must register my business activity with host-nation authorities and apply for any necessary permits or licenses.
- b. The requirement to register my business with host-nation authorities and pay taxes to host-nation tax authorities does not negate the requirement to report any income I derive from that same business to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service.
- c. At the end of each quarter or 8 weeks before leaving the host nation, whichever occurs first, I must report to host-nation tax authorities for assessment and collection of any tax due.
- d. Issuance of my letter of authorization, AEA Form 210-70F, or AEA Form 210-70G does not in itself entitle me to engage in commercial activities on any Army installation. I must apply to local installation commanders to solicit and otherwise engage in commercial activities on installations under their jurisdiction.
- e. Issuance of my letter of authorization, AEA Form 210-70F, or AEA Form 210-70G does not entitle me to any type of logistic support from the United States Government aside from my entitlement to logistic support as a Family member.
- f. If my commercial activity privileges are withdrawn or suspended, I must return my letter of authorization, AEA Form 210-70F, or AEA Form 210-70G to the appropriate issuing authority within 7 days after receipt of notification of the withdrawal or suspension notice.
- g. Commanders have the discretionary prerogative of restricting or prohibiting commercial activities on installations under their jurisdiction.
- h. I must become familiar with and understand commercial activity regulations issued by appropriate headquarters and installation commanders.
- i. Violations of, or noncompliance with commercial activity regulations may result in the withdrawal of my privileges to engage in commercial activities in the Army in Europe area of operation.

3. I further understand that a violation of the provisions of this certificate of understanding may result in the withdrawal of my commercial activity privileges.

4. I also understand that my commercial activities are subject to the customs, business registrations, and tax laws of the host nation where I seek to do business. In this regard, it is understood that my commercial activities may require the advice of local attorneys and possible Government customs officials to ensure my business activities are in compliance with local law.

5. I understand that my contracts are governed by the requirements of the host-nation law. I will inform the personnel whom I contract that host-nation law applies.

**STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING
FOR LIFE INSURANCE/MUTUAL FUNDS/SECURITIES**

(AEA Reg 210-70)

I understand that the lending, reproduction, or alteration of AEA Form 210-70G is cause for withdrawal of the solicitation privilege. I also understand that --

- a. Issuance of AEA Form 210-70G does not in itself entitle me to solicit on any Army installation and that I must apply to each local installation coordinator to solicit on Army installations in Europe.
- b. Commanders have no authority to waive regulatory restrictions on solicitation and, for this reason, regardless of command consent, approval, or invitation, I cannot teach classes to Servicemembers as part of a command or on-post private organization program on investments, insurance, personal finances, or military benefits; solicit without an appointment; solicit in barracks or dormitories occupied as such; or address formations of Servicemembers.
- c. Accreditation does not entitle me or the company I represent to any type of logistic support from the U.S. Government.
- d. I may not use, with or without pay, the services of military personnel or DOD civilian employees in commercial solicitation activities.
- e. I may not solicit sales of commodities or services for any firm other than the one identified in my accreditation to any DOD personnel on or off military installations.
- f. I may not use any type of official identification document other than AEA Form 210-70G with my own passport to gain access to Army installations for the purpose of commercial business solicitation.
- g. Door-to-door solicitation is not authorized on Army installations.

h. I may not solicit Servicemembers in barracks or dormitories or when they are on duty; and I may not solicit civilian employees during duty hours. All solicitation I do will be only by appointment.

i. I may not possess or use DOD or service allotment-authorization forms.

j. I am not authorized to enter restricted areas of military installations.

k. If I sell life insurance to personnel in grades E1 through E3, I must explain the insurance coverage and ensure that the applicant is counseled by the unit insurance officer concerning the purchase of the policy.

l. Commanders have the prerogative of restricting or prohibiting solicitation on installations under their jurisdiction at their discretion.

m. It is my responsibility to become familiar with and understand commercial solicitation regulations issued by the Army in Europe and community commanders.

n. Violations or noncompliance with commercial solicitation regulations in the Army in Europe may result in the withdrawal of my privilege of soliciting on installations in the entire Army in Europe area of operation.

o. In consideration of being granted the privilege to solicit on military installations in the Army in Europe, I (we) agree and pledge to be bound by DOD Instruction 1344.07, AR 210-7 (including the Standards of Fairness (app B)), AEA Regulation 210-70, and U.S. and local consumer protection laws. In case of a conflict between these bodies of law, the one with the provisions more beneficial to the customer will apply.

Enclosure 1: General Rules & Prohibited Activities for Home-Based Businesses

No.	General Rules & Prohibited Activities for Home-Based Businesses (Customs purview)
1.	Any employment other than with the U.S. Government, and any other activities with the purpose of generating revenues (for example, freelancing, HBB) are generally subject to HN laws and regulations as well as to HN taxation. This also applies to business activities that take place within the U.S. military communities only.
2.	All foreign acquired items must be declared to HN customs and be customs-cleared before they may be used for revenue-generating activities.
3.	The use of U.S. Forces-registered privately owned vehicles (POVs) for HBB activities is prohibited. U.S. Forces-registered POVs will not bear signs advertising HBB goods or services.
4.	The use of tax-free and duty-free gasoline, whether purchased with AAFES gas cards or at AAFES service stations, for HBB activities is prohibited.
5.	The MPS may not be used to send or receive any parcels or correspondence related to the HBB. (This does not preclude customers from receiving goods ordered through an HBB and mailed directly to individual customers by the vendor/supplier through either the U.S. or HN postal service.)
4.	Individuals may not purchase goods for demonstration, resale, or operation of the HBB (e.g., ledger books, computers) from AAFES, the AAFES catalog, a commissary, or any other tax-free or duty-free sales facility (e.g., an installation bowling alley). Individuals may not use AE Form 550-175A to import tax-free or duty-free goods for demonstration, resale, or for operation of the HBB. Individuals may not use value-added tax (VAT) deduction forms (e.g., the <i>Abwicklungsschein</i> (form required for requesting VAT relief in Germany)) to purchase goods for demonstration, resale, or operation of the HBB.
5.	Individuals operating a HBB are liable for all applicable HN individual and business taxes and fees. They may also be liable for U.S. income, social security, and corporate taxes. Individuals operating an HBB must obtain an HN tax number and may be required to obtain a U.S. taxpayer identification number.

15-2. REGULATED ACTIVITIES AND PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

a. Personnel subject to this publication will comply with all publications as well as with HN rules and regulations outlined in the applicable section in appendix A.

b. Personnel subject to this publication will not—

(1) Use their importation or exportation privileges for profit or personal gain for themselves or others or use their customs and tax entitlements to purchase tax-exempt merchandise for profit or to obtain personal gain for themselves or someone else, or to conduct a business (AE Reg 600-1, para 12).

(2) Make false oral or written customs declarations to conceal goods or information from customs officials.

(3) Import or export prohibited goods.

(4) Import or export restricted items in excess of authorized amounts without paying applicable customs duties and taxes.

(5) Import or export U.S. Government property without proper authority.

(6) Import goods or pets without complying with German health or public safety laws.

(7) Engage in or assist black-market activities. Black-market activities include the illegal transfer of rationed items or other tax-free goods with the intent of profit or personal gain.

(8) Transfer goods bought under duty- and tax-free conditions to other persons unless this publication or other applicable U.S. Forces regulations authorize the transfer.

(9) Cross borders without complying with applicable travel requirements. U.S. Forces personnel will follow DOD 4500.54-G and applicable service and theater command directives.

(10) Permit personnel who are not members of the U.S. Forces to independently operate a U.S. Forces-registered vehicle unless they have an approved AEA Form 550-175D or other written authorization signed by the CEA.

(11) Knowingly provide incorrect information when applying for AEA Form 550-175A, AEA Form 550-175B, AEA Form 550-175D, AEA Form 550-175K, AEA Form 550-175M, or AEA Form 550-175L.

(12) Use a U.S. Forces-registered vehicle and duty- and tax-free fuel to conduct commercial activities.

(13) Engage in home-based business (HBB) (AEA Reg 210-70) without proper registration approval through the garrison commander and the German finance office.

NOTE: Personnel and dependents planning on teleworking for non-U.S. Forces employers under self-employed status (freelance work including telework) are recommended to contact the legal assistance office.

(14) Fail to report any remuneration or revenue from a non-U.S. Forces employment or business activity (including property rental) to the HN as applicable by laws and regulations.

15-3. PUNISHMENTS FOR CIVILIAN AND MILITARY PERSONNEL

German authorities can prosecute both military and civilian violators, assess fines, and demand the reimbursement of any duties or taxes evaded. These punishments may run independently of the U.S. military judicial or civilian misconduct systems.

a. Military Personnel.

(1) Violations of the specific prohibitions and requirements of this regulation by Soldiers may result in adverse administrative action or punitive action under the provisions of the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

(2) Violators may be subject to administrative action, such as withdrawal of ration, exchange, and commissary privileges.

(3) Failure to specifically identify a provision as punitive will not relieve anyone from penalty or prosecution for a violation of a provision that is also a violation of German or U.S. law.

(4) Violations will be reported to HN authorities as applicable. Serious offenses could be handled by the German judicial system, and any jail sentences pronounced by a German court would be spent in a German prison.

b. Civilian Personnel.

(1) A violation of any of the requirements described in this regulation may constitute a criminal offense under HN law, punishable by administrative fine or imprisonment as authorized by law. Violations will be reported to the U.S. military and HN authorities.

(2) Violations of these provisions by civilian employees may result in the loss of ration, exchange, and commissary entitlements; in being barred from installations; and could even warrant removal from Federal service.

(3) HN authorities may prosecute violators, assess fines, and charge evaded customs duties and taxes. Serious offenses could be handled by the German judicial system, and any jail sentences pronounced by a German court would be spent in a German prison. Prosecution by the U.S. Department of Justice is also possible for the violation of certain provisions of this regulation.

c. Dependents of Military and Civilian Personnel.

(1) Violations of the provisions outlined in this regulation by dependents may result in the loss of ration, exchange, and commissary entitlements; in being barred from installations; and could even warrant the command-directed return of the dependents.

(2) Serious offenses could be handled by the German judicial system, and any jail sentences pronounced by a German court would be spent in a German prison. Prosecution by the U.S. Department of Justice is also possible for the violation of certain provisions of this regulation.

**HBBs operating in Government housing involving food production and sale are not subject to public health inspections as a food establishment under the Tri-Service Food Code. However, there are specific requirements governing the production and sale of cottage foods. In general, HBBs may not sell high-risk foods as described in TB MED 530, section 8-301.12. However, the preparation and selling of these foods may be approved by the local regulatory authority on a case-by-case basis when suitable controls are identified and maintained.
